LAND OF THE MIDNIGHT SUN

There are nine different aboriginal languages spoken in the NWT. Languages develop over thousands of years and they tell us a lot about the people who speak them and the environment that they live in. We asked speakers of some of these languages to translate some keywords related to the way the sun and the earth interact.

You'll see that some words translate easily and some need very long explanations. There are many words that have no translation. The same is true when trying to translate from aboriginal languages into English and French. We asked the translators to provide some back translations too. These show how different the literal meaning of the translation can be from the original English.

Spring Equinox

Date that marks the end of winter and beginning of spring. On this date the days and nights are of equal length.

Summer Solstice

Date that marks the end of spring and the beginning of summer. On this date the top of the world tilts toward the sun to its maximum extent.

Fall Equinox

Date that marks the end of summer and beginning of autumn. On this date the days and nights are of equal length

Winter Solstice

Date that marks the end of autumn and the beginning of winter. On this date the top of the world tilts away from the sun to its maximum extent.

Albedo Effect

The proportion of the incident light or radiation that is reflected by a surface, typically that of a planet or moon.

South slavey	Zhat'ah gokésadénįdį / Reflections (off objects) from outer space

Inuvialuktun	Tatqiariktuaq quamaniq / Bright moon



Reflection

The throwing back by a body or surface of light, heat, or sound without absorbing it: the reflection of light.

South Slavey Gok'eesadénidi / Reflection off an object

North Slavey Gorek'ale

Inuvialuktun Uyumiriaqtuaq / Reflection of sunlight through the atmosphere when the weather is hot.

Absorption

The process or action by which one thing absorbs or is absorbed by another

South Slavey	T'ahsíı, t'ahsíı gulíı tah/zhíéh at'íh / Something being absorbed by another
North Slavey	Asíí godarewi, asíí t'a godarewi
Inuvialuktun	Kinitaa / Immersed it

Solar

Something originating from the sun.

Dogrib	Sadè
Inuktitut	Siqinirmik / Becoming or created out of the sun
South Slavey	Sadee / Sun induced energy
North Slavey	Sade
Inuvialuktun	Siqiniq isaktuaq / Where the sun begins
Inuinnaqtun	Hiqiningminhakugiqqutalik / Gets its strength from the sun



Solar Panels

Panels that absorb the Sun's energy and convert it into electricity.

Dogrib	Sadè t'à egàk'òtl'ì etlè / Sun produces electricity
Inuktitut	Siqinirmik / Becoming or created out of the sun
South Slavey	T'ahsíı sadee náhtsí / Objects that capture the sun's energy
North Slavey	Sade t'a niwi
Inuvialuktun	Siqiniim qaumaksimayaa / The sun emitting light
Inuinnaqtun	Hatuuliathiqiningminhukugiqqutalgit
Chipewyan	Sá thël t'a ?eghálena / By the Sun's heat it works
